## Motorcycle Riders Foundation The Bad News

At the MRF Meeting of the Minds Conference in Denver in September the MRF Board of Directors had to give us some very bad news. The MRF is almost out of money and after January there may not be enough funds to support all of the activities of the MRF this would include no conferences, no MRF Reports Newsletter and the Board of Directors will not hold any board meetings. The funds that they have at this point will keep the office in Washington DC open. You ask why should I care, why should I sign up for MRF? Here are some reasons why you should become a member.

First, the MRF has an office in Washington, D.C. with two full-time employees – one of them being a federal lobbyist looking out and arguing for your right to ride free and promoting motorcycle safety and awareness. If you sign up for the MRF mailing list online, you receive regular email reports about what **your** lobbyist is doing in our Capitol.

Next, the MRF conducts three seminars a year; BEAST of the East in the Eastern U.S., BEST of the West in the Western U.S. and the national conference, the Meeting of the Minds, usually

located in the heartland – to educate motorcyclists on topics that are necessary for freedom fighters to conduct business in this new era. And finally, the MRF is funded by members only. We represent you as a motorcycle rider in Washington, D.C.

The reason for this written commercial: Just like our volatile economy, the MRF is in a deficit. It's not that we're spending some outrageous amount of money on pizza or beer or anything – it's that our donations are down considerably, and a pattern is developing. Donations and pledges are what fund the MRF. It costs in the neighborhood of \$2000 per day to operate the MRF Office in D.C. and conduct business throughout the year.

What should this mean to you? The MRF needs members and we need them now. These are desperate times. We need to sign-up or renew expired members to the tune of 600 by January and another 600 by March to allow us to continue to publish our newsletter the "MRF Reports" every other

month. This publication is the lifeblood of the MRF- it informs members of our efforts in Washington, D.C., six times a year. Without it, we lose a major pipeline of information to the motorcycle community – about their very freedom. Bottom Line – Without the MRF there to represent your voice on a Federal Level, that leaves the road wide open for the states to be forced into legislation that they wouldn't have chosen for themselves – such as a federal helmet law or further deterioration of our current freedoms.

If you have ever been an MRF member, please renew and continue to show your true colors as a New Mexican Freedom Fighter. If you have never been a member of the MRF, consider the benefits – your freedom represented on the Federal level.

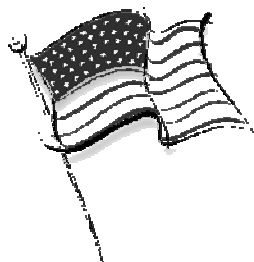
**NMMRO Happenings** *By Barbara Alvar NMMRO Chairperson*

## Motorcycle Rider's Foundation Meeting of the Minds

Last September I was privileged to attend the Motorcycle Riders Foundation Meeting of the Minds in Denver. At that conference I attended a presentation by a member of the Federation of European Motorcyclists' Assoc. to find out what issues motorcyclists are dealing with worldwide. Many of us can't imagine that anything happening in Europe could possibly affect us but the reality is that the United Nations is now concerning itself with motorcycling worldwide through the World Health Organization & the UN Economic Commission for Europe. Around 10 years ago we started hearing about the effort to require higher emission standards for motorcycles worldwide, now builders are finding out in this country that they can't register their custom bikes because they don't meet emission standards required by the Environmental Protection

Agency. If that doesn't prove that we have to consider ourselves to be a part of a worldwide community, just look at the economic crisis that we are currently undergoing. This isn't just affecting us; it is affecting the entire world. That said, here is a little bit of what we have to look forward to.

In Europe, emission requirements are enforced using anti-tampering bolts on exhaust pipes. If you are pulled over & you have changed your pipes your bike is impounded & destroyed. Mandatory power limits are imposed on all motors, noise levels are strictly enforced, there are mandatory anti-lock brakes & if you break these rules your bike is impounded & destroyed. Speed management enforced by connecting a global positioning system to your ignition thereby enabling your bike to be shut down by remote control. And in some places the answer to the problem of motorcyclists

dying in accidents is to outlaw motorcycles completely. These "solutions" are just some of the issues that the Federation of European Motorcyclists Association is currently dealing with. We can expect to be dealing with some of these same "solutions" within the next 10 years & the Motorcycle Riders Foundation is the organization that is keeping a watchful eye on what is happening both nationally & internationally. The MRF is the organization that always intercedes on the behalf all riders. The cost to protect your right to ride is high & the MRF is in danger of having to close their doors at a time when they are needed the most. You can help keep the fight alive by joining the MRF. Consider the money you spend on MRF membership an investment toward maintaining your right to ride, both now & in the future. The MRF needs your help now in order to continue to fight for your rights.

**Shadowriders MC** is an independent club out of Valencia County. Men and women both hold equal patches and officer's positions. Their motto is **Assisting others not as fortunate**. They are a close knit group who always has fun together whether it is riding, partying, barbecues, or just hanging out. It's like having a second family, sometimes even closer than immediate family.

As a group they've had several events to raise funds. The funds have been used to assist the local community and charities. Their bike washes and benefits

runs have helped families in need. They have assisted families with medical expenses and funerals. Last Christmas they adopted 11 children and supplied them with toys and clothes.

This year they bought school supplies for all 72 foster kids in Valencia County. They recently supplied and delivered 10 needy families with Thanksgiving baskets. The baskets included all the food needed for a thanksgiving meal. They held the first Shadowriders sponsored Bike Show in

December to raise money for toys for kids. They again help underprivileged children and with toys and clothes for Christmas. They provided 175 head start children with Christmas teddy bears.

The club is thankful to many. They acknowledge all this would not be possible if not for the support of the community, local business, family and friends.

## 2009 Legislative Session by CJ August NMMRO board member

The 2009 Legislative session was a 60 day session this year. I personally marvel at the fact that our state legislature manages to get any of the important bills heard in committees, voted on by the house of representatives and the state senate and on to the governor for review in these whirlwind sessions. We again held BIKE DAY at the State Capitol and had an outstanding presence at with about 100 bikers in attendance. Thanks to those who participated.

There were two hot issues that pertain to motorcyclists this year. One was a gang penalty enhancement bill. We watched this bill wanting to make sure it did not end up being worded so it would incriminate innocent motorcycle club members. This bill didn't even make it to be voted on in the house or senate so the point was

moot.

We again lobbied for the bill that would increase penalties for motorists who cause death or great bodily injury when they fail to yield the right of way to other motorists. (Yes, we have been working on this one since the 2005). The bill died in the house judiciary committee. We are working with state representatives to have the bill researched in an interim committee so that a bill can be crafted which would pass the legislature and become law.
